Keynote Speaker
Ir Wai Chi-Sing, JP, Permanent Secretary for Development (Works), Development Bureau

Ir Wai Chi-sing obtained his first degree in civil engineering from the University of Hong Kong, and his master degree in transportation engineering from the Purdue University in the United States. He has professional qualifications in civil, structural and geotechnical engineering.

Ir Wai joined the Hong Kong Government as an Assistant Engineer in August 1980, and since then his career has been closely associated with the development of Hong Kong's infrastructure. He has served in the Transport Department, the former Territory Development Department, the Highways Department, and the Works Branch of the former Environment, Transport and Works Bureau. He was the Director of the Highways Department from November 2006 to June 2010 and has been appointed Permanent Secretary for Development (Works) since June 2010.

Professor K. W. Chau is a past president of the Hong Kong Institute of Surveyors (2009-10). He is currently Chair Professor and Head of the Department of Real Estate and Construction and Director of the Ronald Coase Centre for Property Rights Research at The University of Hong Kong. His main areas of research include real estate finance and economics, real estate price index and urban analysis. Most of his works are empirical studies with implications for policy makers and practitioners. He received the International Real Estate Society Achievement Award in 1999. He served as president of Asian Real Estate Society (1996-7), and International Real Estate Society (2000-1).

Christopher is currently the Executive Director of the Construction Industry Council and a Board member of the Zero Carbon Building limited, an entity created by the Construction Industry Council to promote the effective use of energy within buildings within the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region of the People's Republic of China. In 2001-2002 he was awarded Director of the Year by the Hong Kong Institute of Directors for his strive towards excellence in Corporate Governance and is currently the Deputy Chairman of the Institute. In 2007 he was awarded Young Global Leader by the World Economic Forum and is actively involved with the Forum's affairs.

Christopher has been nominated by his peers as one of the world's leading practitioners in Commercial Arbitration and Mediation – The International Who's Who of Commercial Arbitrators and Mediators and is on the panel of arbitrators and mediators of various leading arbitration and mediation centres around the world. In 2014 he was awarded Mediation Lawyer of the Year by the London based Finance Monthly Global Awards. Christopher holds qualifications in computing, engineering and law. He is an accredited mediator, chartered arbitrator, chartered engineer, chartered information technology professional and a law professor. He is a recognised authority on alternative dispute resolution techniques and is a sought-after speaker/moderator at international forums. He has written substantially on the subject of international arbitration and mediation in particular has written the leading handbook, Arbitration Law in Hong Kong, published by Lexis Nexis Butterworths as well as the leading textbook on Mediation, Mediation in Hong Kong: Law and Practice to be published by Kluwer Law in June 2014.

He was the Head of BRE from academic year 2005/6 to 2007/08, and is currently the Award Coordinator for the BSc (Hons) in Property Management. He has 30 years of academic and practical experiences, and has published more than two hundred papers including journal articles, conference papers, professional journals, research monographs, and consultancy reports. His main research interests include affordable housing development, and construction safety.

Francis obtained his BSc (Hons) in Building from the then Brighton Polytechnic, MSc in Architecture from the London University, and his PhD from the South Bank University. Ms Rosana Wong, Executive Director, Yau Lee Construction Company Limited

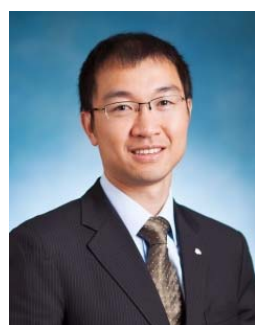

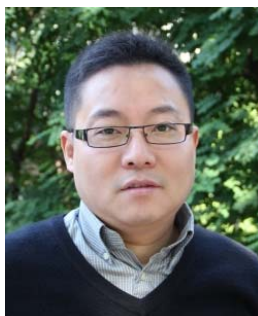
