Winner of the HKIPM Awards 2013 – Category: Construction / Engineering "Public Rental Housing Development at Eastern Harbour Crossing (EHC) Site Phase 5"

Synopsis of the Project

Situated among the densely developed Eastern Harbour Crossing (EHC) Phases 1, 3 and 4 sites, EHC Phase 5 aimed to achieve a comprehensive design in the context of the whole EHC development to achieve a balanced solution and addressing the various site and environmental constraints.

The planning and design theme of the project is to create a sustainable community for a green and healthy living habitat. Commitments from the integrated project team and community participation are vital to the success of the project. The core values of Caring, Customer focused, Creative and Commitment of the Hong Kong Housing Authority (HKHA) underpinned the work.

The HKHA pioneered to adopt microclimate studies to enhance the wind environment, natural ventilation, daylight, and mitigate solar heat gain, etc. A holistic approach to optimizing the development potential and enhancing the built environment with the neighbourhood was adopted. Construction works went smoothly and met the key performance indicators covering quality, safety, environmental management, time and cost.

Partnering with all key stakeholders, including the residents, consultants, contractors, academia, and various organizations, is the major driver towards achieving excellence in Project Management, Sustainability and Quality of this project. The implementation of quality management system throughout the supply chain assured quality products despite the tight budget. The success of the project is well reflected from the high satisfaction rate from the resident survey carried out after occupation. A harmonious community for happy families was created.

Synopsis of the Project

Redevelopment of the Yau Tong, Ko Chiu, Eastern Harbour Crossing (EHC) and Lei Yue Mun district in east Kowloon district started in 1990s, which is literally a mega-scale urban regeneration project that provides shelter for over 100,000 public housing residents. DOMAIN, at the heart of the district, is the final phase of this mega project, comprising a shopping centre, a community hall, open space and a public transport interchange (PTI) linking to the MTR Yau Tong Station. Its completion in 2012 sets an important milestone for a two-decade long urban renewal process, and acts as an urban magnet and a community that is accessible, lively and green.

The design of DOMAIN focused on its commercial sustainability as well as its environmental sustainability. Numerous stakeholders had been involved and changed hands over time as well as their aspirations. Various interfacing parties such as the MTR Corporation Limited (MTRC) and the government works departments had been carrying out their own infrastructure works contemporaneously with HKHA's construction works for district renewal.

As the project manager of DOMAIN, the Hong Kong Housing Authority (HKHA), had therefore tackled the project from two directions namely Technical Management and People Management. It was accomplished through pioneering the entrustment of foundation works to the MTRC in 1998, the collaborative execution of improvement works at the MTR Station Forecourt in 2009 between the MTRC and HKHA, regular engagements of the community and stakeholders at various stages, just to name a few.
